JOB LOSS AND REVERSE MIGRATION

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is aware of several millions of job loss and reverse migration in unorganized sector with the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic situation in the country which had thrown out the poor labour class in the streets;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State/Sector-wise;
- (c) whether the Government has taken any steps to arrest this trend and to create more employment opportunities to the working class in the country;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (e): The global spread of the corona virus (COVID-19) followed by lockdowns has affected global economies including India. Covid-19 has resulted in large number of migrant workers going back to their native places and loss of jobs has also been observed in India during this period. Government has taken initiatives for creating jobs at local levels & supporting migrant workers through Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana, Aatmanirbhar Bharat & Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Rozgar Abhayan. Aatmanirbhar Bharat is based on Economy, Infrastructure, System, Vibrant Demography and Demand to create jobs for the youth. It encompasses an economic package of Rs. 20 Lakh Crores for facilitating creation of employment opportunities in the country.

Under PMGKY, besides providing foodgrains, exgratia payments directly in the accounts of beneficiaries, EPF contribution for employees working in certain establishments was also made by the Government to support the Industry particularly MSME Sector. Further, the wage under MGNREGA has also been increased from Rs.182 per day to Rs.202 which has benefitted about 13.62 Crore families.

Government of India under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Rozgar Abhyan (PMGKRA) has taken various initiatives to boost rural infrastructure & rural economy to provide local employment opportunities particularly to the migrant returnees. It covers 116 districts of 6 States with a resource envelope of Rs 50,000 crore is being implemented in a mission mode campaign of 125 days through Ministry of Rural Development.

Government has also announced the measures to strengthen Infrastructure Logistics, Capacity Building, Governance and Administrative Reforms for Agriculture, Fisheries and Food Processing Sectors.

Government of India has launched PM SVANidhi Scheme to facilitate collateral free working capital loan upto Rs.10,000/- of one-year tenure, to approximately, 50 lakh street vendors, to resume their businesses.

- (a) whether the Government is aware of the problems of jobless youths in the country due to COVID-19 pandemic and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the total number of persons rendered jobless in this period; and
- (c) the assistance provided by the Union Government to the States particularly Kerala, Maharashtra in meeting the jobless situation;
- (d) whether the Government has done any assessment of the job loss in the country due to the COVID-19 crisis; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof, sector wise?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (c): The global spread of the corona virus (COVID-19) followed by lockdowns has affected global economies including India. Government is taking several steps to ensure that we are well prepared to face the challenges and threats posed by covid-19. Aatmanirbhar Bharat which focuses on Economy, Infrastructure, System, Vibrant Demography and Demand to create jobs for the youth has been launched.

To boost employment and livelihood opportunities for migrant workers returning to villages, in the wake of COVID-19 outbreak, Government of India has launched Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan on 20th June 2020. Abhiyaan focuses on developing rural infrastructure and providing modern facilities like internet in the villages. Skill Mapping of the rural migrant labour being done to help them work closer home. Abhiyaan involves intensified and focused implementation of 25 target driven works to provide employments and create infrastructure in the rural areas of 116 districts of 6 States with a resource envelope of Rs 50,000 crore.

Government has taken various steps for generating employment in the country like increasing public expenditure on schemes such as Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS), Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) and Deendyal Antodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM).

Under Skill India Mission, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship is implementing a flagship scheme known as the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal VikasYojana (PMKVY) 2016-20 with an objective to provide skilling to one crore people under Short Term Training (STT) and Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) across the country for four years i.e. 2016-2020.

Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY) has been initiated by Government inter alia for facilitating self-employment. Under PMMY collateral free loans upto Rs. 10 lakh, are extended to micro/small business enterprises and to individuals to enable them to setup or expand their business activities. (d) & (e) No, Sir.

- (a)the details of statutes governing the working conditions including salary, perks etc. of the journalists in the country;
- (b) the mechanism put in place by the Government to ensure its strict compliance across the country;
- (c)whether the print and electronic media persons and journalists are covered under the Minimum Wages Act, Provident Fund, ESI pension scheme(s) and Social Security Schemes; and
- (d)if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

 ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a)& (b): The Working Journalists and Other Newspaper Employees (Conditions of Service) and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1955, inter alia, covers under its ambit conditions of employment of working journalists for improvement and regulation of the service conditions of Working Journalists and also for Non-Journalists Newspaper Employees.

The Working Journalists Act addresses the issues of hours of work, leave fixation and revising rates of wages which includes the constitution of a Wage Board. The Working Journalists Act also provides for the Board so established to provide its recommendations and defines the powers and procedure of the Board. It also gives the Central Government powers to enforce the recommendations of the Wage Board.

primary responsibility for implementation of lies with the State recommendations Governments/UTs. responsibility of the State Governments include creating special cells. to oversee the progress of implementation of Wage recommendations, to send the Quarterly Progress Report to the Ministry and to gear up the State Labour Enforcement Machinery to ensure speedy and prompt implementation of the recommendations of the Wage Boards. The Ministry has a Central Level Monitoring oversee the implementation of Wage Committee to **Recommendations by the States.**

(c) & (d): The news paper establishments and Electronic Media Companies in private sector are covered under Employees' Provident Funds & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952. The employees working in these establishments are entitled to social security benefits in the form of Provident Fund, Pension and Deposit-Linked Insurance under provisions of the Act and the Schemes framed thereunder. Moreover, print and electronic media persons and journalists who are getting salary up to Rs. 21,000/- per month and employed in the units/establishments covered under the ESI Act, 1948 are coverable under the Act. After coverage, insured persons are eligible to avail the benefits provided under the Act as per their entitlement.

Further, the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting implements "Journalist Welfare Scheme" to provide one time ex-gratia relief on urgent basis to journalists or their families under extreme hardship or on account of death of journalists and also to the journalists in case of permanent disability, major ailments and in case of accidents causing serious injuries necessitating hospitalization.

- (a)whether the Government is aware that condition of labourers has deteriorated due to Covid 19 pandemic;
- (b)if so, the details thereof and the Government initiatives by extending assistance during the period;
- (c)the total quantum of amount withdrawn from Employment Provident Fund Account during lockdown period of Covid 19 pandemic, till date, State-wise; and
- (d)the further steps taken/being taken by the Government to help the labourers by generating more employment in the country; and
- (e)whether the Government is planning any other social security measures for those in the provident fund network and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) & (b): In order to ameliorate the hardships faced by the labourers due to economic disruption caused by COVID-19 pandemic, various initiatives have been taken by the Ministry of Labour and Employment as part of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY) and

Atmanirbhar Bharat which, inter-alia, include (i) payment of 12% employers' share and 12% employees' share under Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), totalling 24% by the Government of India for six months from March to August, 2020 for having up to 100 employees with 90% of such establishments employees earning less than Rs.15,000/- monthly wage; (ii) reduction in PF contribution from 12% to 10% of wages for the wage months of May, June and July, 2020; (iii) non-refundable Covid advance from the PF by amending the EPF Scheme, 1952; (iv) extension in the date of filing of returns; (v) issuing advisory to promptly attend to distress calls of workers /employees and also guide them in temporary shelters; (vi) using Building and other construction workers (BOCW) cess fund for transfer of adequate funds in the bank account of construction workers affected by COVID-19 outbreak; (vii) supporting employees and workers by not terminating them and not cutting their wages; and (viii) for taking preventive measures to contain the spread of COVID-19.

- (c): A statement showing the total quantum of amount withdrawn from Employees' Provident Fund Account during lockdown period of Covid-19 pandemic from 25.03.2020 to 31.08.2020, Statewise, is at Annexure-A.
- (d): Government has taken various steps for generating employment in the country like encouraging private sector of the economy, fast tracking various projects involving substantial investment and encouraging public expenditure on schemes such as Prime Minister Employment Generation Programme, Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme, Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana and Deen Dayal Antodaya Yojana National Uraban Livelihoods Mission, National Carrier Service, Pradhan Mantri Rojgar Protsahan Yojana.
- (e): There is no such proposal under consideration at present.

Will the Minister of **FINANCE** be pleased to state:

- a) whether the Government has announced Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Package to ensure weaker section of the society to get basic amenities and that they do not get impacted during the lockdown period due to Covid-19;
- b) if so, the details thereof along with its aims and objectives and the quantum of financial assistance released under the said package including the number of people who have got benefitted out of this package State/UT-wise;
- c) whether the Government has taken effective steps to ensure that the financial assistance reaches the weaker sections of the society and if so, the details thereof;
- d) the details of criteria fixed by the Government for availing this package; and
- e) the other steps taken by the Government to ensure that the weaker/lower middle and middle class section of the society are provided with basic facilities and amenities at affordable rates during the period of Covid-19 pandemic?

ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE (FINANCE) (SHRI ANURAG SINGH THAKUR)

(a) to (d): Yes, Sir. The Government has announced a Rs 1.70 Lakh Crore relief under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana for the poor to help them fight the battle against Corona Virus The assistance under the package was done through Direct Benefit Transfer in case of cash transfers and after proper verification in other cases. Further, the Empowered Group on Economy and Welfare set up under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Economic Affairs and comprising of Secretaries of various Ministries/Department monitors the implementation of the Package. A

Statement indicating details about the Package is at Annexure-I. State/UT-wise details of beneficiaries and amount disbursed is at the Annexure II (a) & II (b).

(e) A total of INR 68,820 crores have been done as cash transfers to eligible persons under various components of PMGKP as on 7.9.2020. So far 178.85 Lakh MT of foodgrains and 6.82 Lakh MT of pulses have been distributed free of cost to approx. 75 crores beneficiaries under NFSA and this scheme will continue till November 2020. The Government is implementing Ayushman Bharat – Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) to provide health cover of Rs. 5 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization to around 10.74 crore poor and vulnerable families (approx. 50 crore Individuals) as per Socio-Economic Caste Census (SECC) data. To effectively cover AB-PMJAY beneficiaries for testing and treatment of COVID-19, packages for 'Testing for COVID-19' and 'Treatment of COVID-19' have been notified. The Reserve Bank of India had also announced a three-month EMI holiday from March 1, 2020, till May 31, 2020 on all term loan repayments like auto, home, personal loan EMIs etc, which was further extended till August 31, 2020. Further, the facility of free food grains supply was also extended to migrants for 2 months under the Aatma Nirbhar Package announced on 14.05.2020.

Details of PMGKY

I. Insurance scheme for health workers fighting COVID-19 in Government Hospitals and Health Care Centres

An Insurance Scheme for Health Workers Fighting COVID-19' was launched w.e.f. 30.03.2020 to provide comprehensive personal accident cover of Rs. 50 lakh to around 22.12 lakh public healthcare providers, including community health workers, who may have to be in direct contact and care of COVID-19 patients and who may be at risk of being impacted by this. The scheme was initially for 90 days w.e.f. 30.03.2020 and has now been extended by another 90 days. On account of the unprecedented situation, private hospital staff/ retired/volunteer/ local urban bodies/contract/daily wage/ ad-hoc/outsourced staff requisitioned by States/ Central hospitals/autonomous hospitals of Central/States/UTs, AIIMS & INIs/ hospitals of Central Ministries can also be drafted for COVID19 related responsibilities. These cases are also covered under the scheme.

II. PM Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana

Under the scheme, additional allocation of food grain @ 5 kg per person per month free of cost is provided to all the beneficiaries covered under the targeted public distribution system (Antryodaya Anna Yojana & Priority Households) including those covered under Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) for a period of three months i.e. April to June, 2020. About 119.32 LMT of food grains were allotted to approximately 80.96 crore beneficiaries entailing a financial implication of Rs.46061 crore. The scheme has been extended till November, 2020 (5 months) with additional allocation of foodgrain of 202.749 LMT for approx 81.09 crore beneficiaries entailing a food subsidy of Rs.76062.11 crore. Further, Pulses according to regional preferences @ 1 kg per family were provided for three months, free of cost. The scheme has been extended till November, 2020.

III. Benefit to farmers:

The first installment of Rs 2,000 due in 2020-21 was front-loaded and paid in April 2020 itself under the PM KISAN Yojana, covering about 8.7 crore farmers

IV. Cash transfers-

- a) Help to Poor: A total of 20.40 crores (approx) PMJDY women account-holders were given an ex-gratia of Rs 500 per month for next three months.
- b) **Gas cylinders**: A schemes to provide for free of cost LPG cylinders for three months to 8 crore beneficiaries of Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) was started under PMGKP w.e.f. 01.04.2020 with a budgetary support of 13000 crore. Cash advances for buying the cylinders were transferred to the bank account of the beneficiaries. The scheme has been extended till September 30, 2020 for those beneficiaries who have been

credited with the advance for buying refills, but have not been able to buy the free cylinders till 30.06.2020. OMCs have delivered 1321.59 lakh refills to PMUY beneficiaries under this scheme as on 06.09.2020.

- c) **Help to low wage earners in organised sectors**: Wage-earners, earning below Rs 15,000 per month, in businesses having less than 100 workers, were provided Twenty four (24) percent of the monthly wages into their PF accounts, for the next three months to prevent disruption in their employment. The scheme has been extended for another three months, i.e., till August 2020.
- d) **Support for senior citizens (above 60 years), widows and Divyang:** An amount of Rs.1000/- per month for three months to around 3 crore aged widows and people in Divyang category was provided.

V. MNREGA

MNREGA wages were increased by Rs 20 with effect from 1 April, 2020. This wage increase was estimated to provide an additional Rs 2,000 benefit annually to a worker and benefit approximately 13.62 crore families.

V. Self-Help groups: Limit of collateral free lending was increased from Rs 10 to Rs 20 lakhs for women organized through 63 lakhs Self Help Groups (SHGs), who support 6.85 crore households.

VI. Other components of PM Garib Kalyan package

- (a) **Organised sector**: Employees' Provident Fund Regulations was amended to include Pandemic as the reason to allow non-refundable advance of 75 percent of the amount or three months of the wages, whichever is lower, from their accounts. Families of four crore workers registered under EPF can take benefit of this window.
- (b) **Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Fund**: Welfare Fund for Building and Other Constructions Workers has been created under a Central Government Act. There are around 3.5 Crore registered workers in the Fund. State Governments were directed to utilise this fund to provide assistance and support to these workers to protect them against economic disruptions.
- (c) District Mineral Fund: The State Government were asked to utilise the funds available under District Mineral Fund (DMF) for supplementing and augmenting facilities of medical testing, screening and other requirements in connection with preventing the spread of CVID-19 pandemic as well as treating the patients affected with this pandemic.

- (a) & (b): Yes, Sir. The details of claimants, who earn less than Rs.15,000 per month are at Annexure A.
- (c): The Government vide notification No. GSR.225(E) dated 27.03.2020 inserted sub-para (3) under Para 68L of the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) Scheme, 1952 to provide for non-refundable advance to EPF members not exceeding the basic wages and dearness allowances for three months or upto 75 per cent of the amount in the members' EPF account, whichever is less, in the event of outbreak of epidemic or pandemic.

The subscribers were facilitated to submit online claims and the services of EPFO also has been integrated and offered through UMANG application of the Government of India. The entire payment to subscribers is done electronically through Nation Electronic Fund Transfer (NEFT) System.

PACKAGE FOR WORKERS

1162. SHRI ANURAG SHARMA:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a)whether the Government is planning to offer a specific social security package for such workers who are dependent at the mercy of their private employers and mostly have been rendered jobless owing to Corona Virus impact; and
- (b)if so, the modalities of such a package and blueprint for roll out thereof as the number of beneficiaries is likely to be a very sizeable part of our population?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) & (b): Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) provides relief in the form of cash compensation for up to 90 days to the Insured Persons (IPs) who become unemployed, under the Atal Beemit Vyakti Kalyan Yojana provided that they have completed two years of insurable employment and has contributed not less than 78 days in each of the four consecutive contribution periods.

In order to provide relief to the IPs who have been rendered unemployed during COVID-19 Pandemic, the ESIC has enhanced the quantum of benefit and relaxed the eligibility condition of the scheme for the period 24.03.2020 to 31.12.2020 as under:

- 1. Relief to the extent of 50 % of the average per day earning to be paid up to maximum 90 days of unemployment instead of 25% of average per day earning earlier.
- 2. The IP should have been in insurable employment for a minimum period of two years immediately before his/her unemployment and should have contributed for not less than 78 days in the contribution period immediately preceding the unemployment and minimum 78 days in one of the remaining three contribution periods in two years prior to unemployment. Earlier for getting relief under the scheme the IP should have contributed minimum 78 days contribution in 4 contribution periods prior to unemployment.
- 3. Claim shall be due 30 days after date of unemployment as against 90 days earlier.

The claim for relief may be created online on www.esic.in and submitted by the IP in the prescribed claim form duly completed, directly to the Branch office. The relaxations have been notified on 11.09.2020.

Further, in order to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on India's workforce, various initiatives have been taken by the Ministry of Labour and Employment as part of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY) and Atmanirbhar Bharat which, inter-alia, include –

- (i) payment of 12% employers' share and 12% employees' share under Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), totalling 24% by the Government of India for six wage months from March to August, 2020 for all the establishments having up to 100 employees with 90% of such employees earning less than Rs.15,000 monthly wage;
- (ii) reduction in Provident Fund (PF) contribution from 12% to 10% of wages for the wage months of May, June and July, 2020;

- (iii) non-refundable COVID advance from the PF by amending the EPF Scheme, 1952; till date, about Rs 39,000 crore have been withdrawn by members of EPFO.
- (iv) extension in the date of filing of returns;
- (v) issuing advisory to promptly attend to distress calls of workers /employees and also guide them in temporary shelters;
- (vi) using Building and Other Construction Workers (BOCW) cess fund for transfer of funds amounting to approximately Rs.5000 crore in the bank account of around 1.83 crore construction workers affected by COVID-19 outbreak; and
- (vii) Advising employers not to terminate workers and not to cut their wages.

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (c): Ministry of Labour & Employment is implementing the Pradhan Mantri Rojgar Protsahan Yojana (PMRPY) since 2016 with the objective to incentivise employers for creation of employment with social security benefits. Under the scheme, Government of India is paying Employer's full contribution i.e. 12% towards Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) and Employees' Pension Scheme (EPS) both (as admissible from time to time) for a period of three years to the new employees through EPFO w.e.f. 01.04.2018. The terminal date for registration of beneficiary through establishment was 31st March 2019. The beneficiaries registered upto 31st March, 2019 will continue to receive the benefits for 3 years from the date of registration under the scheme.

The details of the employees benefited under PMRPY Scheme in Maharashtra during last four financial years is as follows:-

- a) the list of number of beneficiaries who have availed assistance under the Atma Nirbhar Bharat relief package, State-wise;
- b) the total amount of assistance provided by the Government (sanctioned and availed) under various headings of the said scheme, State-wise along with the overall total assistance provided under AtmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyan;
- c) the list of number of beneficiaries who have availed assistance under the PM Garib Kalyan Yojana and PM Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana, State-wise; and
- d) the total amount of assistance provided by the Government (sanctioned and availed) under various headings of the same and the overall assistance provided?

ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE (FINANCE) (SHRI ANURAG SINGH THAKUR)

(a) to (b): Under the Atma Nirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan various new Schemes/Programmes/policy measures were announced to make the country self-reliant and the Ministries/Department tasked to frame the schemes/programmes as per the announcements. The beneficiary oriented schemes under Atma Nirbhar Bharat were facility of supply of free food grain and pulses to migrants for 2 months and schemes relating to MSMEs i.e. Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme. A statement indicating State-wise benefits availed under the schemes is at Annexure-I. Further, the PM Street Vendor's AatmaNirbhar Nidhi scheme has also been launched on 01.06.2020 to provide working capital loan of upto Rs.10,000/-, repayable in 12 monthly instalments, to street vendors whose business have been affected due to lockdown and who have been vending in urban areas on or before 24.03.2020. As on 10.09.2020, loans for 3.68 lakh street vendors have been approved, out of which loans have been disbursed to 99.000 beneficiaries.

(c) to (d): The Government had also announced a Rs 1.70 Lakh Crore relief under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana for the poor to help them fight the battle against Corona Virus, it includes benefits under Pradhan Mantri Anna Yojana. A total of INR 68,820 crores have been provided as cash transfers to eligible persons under various components of PMGKP as on 7.9.2020. So far 178,85 Lakh MT of foodgrains and 6.82 Lakh MT of pulses have been distributed free of cost to approximately 75 crores beneficiaries under NFSA and this scheme will continue till November 2020. State/UT-wise details of the benefits sanctioned and availed under PM Garib Kalyan Package including PM Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana is at the Annexure II (a) & (b).

1192. SHRI JAGDAMBIKA PAL

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has formulated any policies to raise the level of employment in cities after the start of unlock procedure;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has formulated policy to support or provide employment to the workers of unorganized urban sectors; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (d) :Government has taken various initiatives for creating jobs at local level & supporting workers through Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY), Aatmanirbhar Bharat & Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Rozgar Abhayan (PMGKRA) to mitigate the problems posed by covid-19. Aatmanirbhar Bharat is based on Economy, Infrastructure, System, Vibrant Demography and Demand to create jobs for the youth. It encompasses an economic package of Rs. 20 Lakh crore which inter-alia facilitates creation of employment opportunities in the country in urban & rural areas, organized & unorganized sectors.

Under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojna(PMGKY)launched in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic, Government of India is contributing both 12% employer's share and 12% employee's share under Employees Provident Fund (EPF) totaling 24% of the wage for the wage month from March to August, 2020 for all the establishments having upto 100 employees with 90% of such employees earning less than Rs. 15,000/-.

Statutory Provident Fund(PF) contribution of both employer and employee has been reduced to 10% each from existing 12% each for all establishments covered by Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) for three months.

Government of India has launched PM SVANidhi Scheme to facilitate collateral free working capital loan upto Rs.10,000/- of one-year tenure, to approximately, 50 lakh street vendors, to resume their businesses.

RBI and Government of India have introduced various measures to infuse liquidity in the economy to sustain the market economy and to raise the level of employment.

Employment generation and improving employability has been the priority concern of the Government. Government has taken various steps for generating employment in the country (including cities & workers of urban unorganized sectors) like encouraging private sector of economy, fast-tracking various projects involving substantial investment and increasing public expenditure on schemes such as Deendayal Antodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM),PMEGP, etc.

Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana- National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM) is a scheme of Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs which aims to reduce poverty and vulnerability of urban poor households by enabling them to access gainful self-employment and skilled wage employment opportunities, for improvement in their livelihoods on a sustainable basis.

JOBS UNDER GAREEB KALYAN ROJGAR ABHIYAN

1213. MS DIYA KUMARI:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the total numbers of jobs provided in Rajasthan under the Gareeb Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan; and
- (b) the measures taken by the Government since COVID-19 to provide employment opportunities in rural areas?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (b): The total number of employment generated in persondays in Rajasthan under Gareeb Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan is 1,11,34,3237.

The global spread of the corona virus (COVID-19) followed by lockdowns has affected economies across the globe, including India. Government has taken initiatives for creating jobs at local levels & supporting migrant workers through Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY), Aatmanirbhar Bharat and the Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan Aatmanirbhar Bharat is based on Economy, Infrastructure, System, Vibrant Demography and Demand to create jobs for the youth. It encompasses an economic package of Rs. 20 Lakh crore interalia, for facilitating creation of employment opportunities in the country.

The Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan (GKRA) is a 125-day Abhiyan launched on 20th June, 2020 with a mission to address the issues of returnee migrant workers and similarly affected rural population by Covid-19 pandemic through a multipronged strategy of providing immediate employment & livelihood opportunities to the distressed, to saturate the villages with public infrastructure and creation of livelihood assets, boost the income generation activities and enhance long term livelihood opportunities by giving focus on 25 works in 116 selected districts across 6 States with a resource envelope of Rs 50,000 crore.

Under PMGKY, Government of India is contributing both 12% employer's share and 12% employee's share under Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), totalling 24% of the wage for the wage month from March to August, 2020 for all the establishments having upto 100 employees with 90% of such employees earning less than Rs. 15000/-.

Statutory PF contribution of both employer and employee has been reduced to 10% each from existing 12% each for all establishments covered by EPFO for three months.

ILO REPORT ON INDIA'S WORKFORCE

1242. DR. SHASHI THAROOR: SHRI ANTO ANTONY:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a)whether COVID-19 crisis has pushed about 90% of India's workforce of 500 million in the informal sector out of jobs as per a report by ILO;
- (b)if so, the details thereof;
- (c)whether the Ministry has identified the worst affected sectors and regions and outlined policies to mitigate the crisis as the eventual increase in unemployment will substantially depend on policy measures;
- (d)if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor;
- (e)whether the Government has noticed that a report of ILO that 40 crores of Indian people are being pushed to below poverty line; and
- (f)if so, the details thereof and the steps taken by the Government in this regard?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (f): ILO's report namely "ILO Monitor: COVID-19 and the world of work- Second edition- Updated Estimates and Analysis" (dated 7th April 2020) is available on the website of ILO.

In order to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on India's workforce, various initiatives have been taken by the Ministry of Labour and Employment as part of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMGKY) and Atmanirbhar Bharat which, inter-alia, include-

(i) payment of 12% employers' share and 12% employees' share under Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), totalling 24% by the Government of India for six wage months from March to August, 2020 for all the establishments having up to 100 employees with 90% of such employees earning less than Rs.15,000 monthly wage;

- (ii) reduction in Provident Fund (PF) contribution from 12% to 10% of wages for the wage months of May, June and July, 2020;
- (iii) non-refundable COVID advance from the PF by amending the EPF Scheme, 1952; till date, about Rs 39,000 crore have been withdrawn by members of EPFO.
- (iv) extension in the date of filing of returns;
- (v) issuing advisory to promptly attend to distress calls of workers /employees and also guide them in temporary shelters;
- (vi) using Building and Other Construction Workers (BOCW) cess fund for transfer of around Rs. 5000 crore in the bank accounts of around 1.83 crore construction workers affected by COVID-19 outbreak; and
- (vii) Advising employers not to terminate workers and not to cut their wages;
- (viii) The unemployment benefit under the Atal Beemit Vyakti Kalyan Yojana being implemented by the Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) under Ministry of Labour & Employment has been enhanced to 50% from 25% of the average earning, payable for upto 90 days, along with relaxation of eligibility conditions for insured workers who have lost employment due to COVID-19 pandemic. The enhanced benefit is applicable from 24th March 2020 to 31st December 2020.

Government has taken initiatives for creating jobs at local levels and supporting migrant workers through Atmanirbhar Bharat and the Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan. Atmanirbhar Bharat is based on Economy, Infrastructure, System, Vibrant Demography and Demand to create jobs for the youth. The Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan involves intensified and focussed implementation of 25 target driven works to provide employment and create infrastructure in the rural areas of 116 districts of 6 states with a resource envelope of Rs 50,000 crore to be implemented in a mission mode campaign in 125 days.

Government has also launched PM SVANidhi Scheme to facilitate collateral free working capital loan of upto Rs. 10,000 of one year tenure, to approximately 50 lakh street vendors, to resume their businesses. Reserve Bank of India and the Government have also introduced various measures to infuse liquidity in the economy to sustain the market economy and to raise the level of employment.

WELFARE OF UNSKILLED AND SKILLED MIGRANT LABOURERS

1253. DR. MOHAMMAD JAWED:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a)the details of schemes/programmes started/ implemented by the Government for welfare of unskilled and skilled migrant labourers in the country;
- (b)the State/UT-wise details of the funds sanctioned/released and utilised in the current year;
- (c)whether the Government has conducted or proposes to conduct any study/survey regarding the condition of workers at work places in the wake of COVID-19;
- (d)if so, the details and the findings thereof; and
- (e)the steps taken/ being taken by the Government to improve the overall conditions of the workers including their safety and health from COVID-19 at their work places?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a) to (e): Government has taken a number of measures for the welfare of the migrant workers, especially after the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic.

Around 1.83 crore Building and Other Construction (BOC) workers have been given cash assistance from the cess fund. State-wise details is annexed.

Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) has launched a scheme for Affordable Rental Housing Complexes (ARHCs), which is a sub-Scheme under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Urban (PMAY-U) to create vibrant, sustainable & inclusive Affordable Rental Housing avenues for urban migrants/poor.

Beneficiaries for ARHCs will be from Economically Weaker Section (EWS)/Low Income Group (LIG) category including industrial workers, migrants working with market/trade associations, educational/health institutions, hospitality sector, long term tourists/visitors, students etc.

Government of India has launched PM SVANidhi Scheme to facilitate collateral free working capital loan upto Rs. 10,000/- of one-year tenure, to approximately, 50 lakh street vendors, to resume their businesses.

Approximately 80 crore beneficiaries are being provided additional 5 kg wheat or rice and 1 kg of preferred pulses, free of cost every month till November, 2020 under provisions of National Food Security Act.

In addition 30 lakh BOC workers have been given food package relief also from cess fund. To boost employment and livelihood opportunities for migrant workers returning to villages, in the wake of COVID-19 outbreak, Government of India has launched Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan on 20th June, 2020. The Abhiyaan focuses on durable rural infrastructure and providing modern facilities like internet in the villages. Skill Mapping of the rural migrant labour is being done to help them work closer home. The Abhiyaan involves intensified and focused implementation of 25 target driven works to provide employment and create infrastructure in the rural areas of 116 districts of 6 States with a resource envelope of Rs 50,000 crore.

The Central Government has issued comprehensive Advisory Guidelines on 27.07.2020 to all the States/UTs for the welfare of the migrant workers returning to the destination States in the backdrop of Covid-19.

PLANTATION WORKERS

1288. SHRI RAJU BISTA:

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the steps being taken by the Ministry to ensure that Tea and Cinchona Plantation workers are paid their dues during the COVID lockdown period;
- (b)whether the Ministry is taking any action on plantation owners who do not pay their share of Provident Fund; and
- (c)if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a): Plantation workers are covered by the Plantation Labour Act 1951 which inter-alia, covers the welfare of planation workers including tea workers and cinchona workers.

The workers are also covered by various industrial and social security legislations like Employees' Compensation Act, 1923, Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972, Payment of Bonus Act, 1965, Maternity Benefit Act, 1961, Payment of Wages Act, 1936, Equal Remuneration Act, 1976, Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 and Industrial Employment (Standing Order) Act, 1946 as applicable.

The steps taken by this Ministry during the COVID lockdown period are as follows:

- (1) An advisory was issued to the Employers Associations wherein the Employers of Public/Private Establishments were advised not to terminate their employees or reduce their wages.
- (2) Twenty Control Rooms were set up by Ministry of Labour and Employment across the country to receive and address the grievances of workers regarding wages etc. during the national lockdown.
- (b) to (c): The Employers of covered establishments under EPF & MP Act, 1952 including Plantation establishments are required to file Electronic Challan cum Return (ECR) in respect of all their employees and remit the dues within 15 days of close of wage month.

In the event of non-filing of ECR, the employers are alerted through SMS/email to remit the dues and if compliance is not made, action is taken to inspect the records of estt, assess the amount in default by quasi-judicial process u/s 7A of EPF & MP Act, 1952 and recover the assessed dues. Penalty is imposed u/s 14B of the Act for wilful default in payment of dues.

The aforesaid action against defaulter is a continuous process as per the various provisions of the Act till compliance is secured.

Keeping in view the social distancing norms during Covid-19 Pandemic and provide ease and convenience to employers & employees:

- i. e-Inspection was introduced to enable the employers to inform the outstanding dues, propose timeline to remit the dues and intimate closure of their business.
- ii. system of virtual hearings in the quasi judicial cases under section 7A & 14B was recently launched by Hon'ble MoS (I/C), L&E, to hear the parties and fast track the assessment of worker's dues.

During 2019-20, Rs.7849.51 lakhs has been assessed under Section 7A, Rs.265.37 lakhs levied under Section 14B and Rs 8750.99 lakhs has been recovered from Tea and Cinchona Plantation establishments.

During the year 2019-20, complaints have been filed with police in 54 cases of non-payment of employees share contributions deducted from wages of employees of Tea Plantation.

(a) to (d): States/UTs have been advised to regulate the conduct of private placement agencies. Complaints, if any are received by respective State Governments/UT administration and are dealt under the provisions of IPC or others prevailing Acts under which such establisments are registered. Central Government and many State Governments have launched online jobportals so that job-seekers can connect with the employer and vice-versa free of cost. Central Government is also assisting State Governments to modernize employment exchanges for providing employment services to job seekers.

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a): The details of rate of interest paid to the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) subscribers during the last three financial years are as under:

(b) & (c): The rate of interest to be credited to EPF members' accounts is based on Incomes and Liabilities for the particular financial year as per Paragraph 60(4) of the EPF Scheme 1952. In view of exceptional circumstances arising out of COVID-19, the agenda regarding Interest Rate was reviewed by the Central Board, EPF in its 227th Meeting held on 9th September, 2020 and it recommended the earlier rate of interest @ 8.50% for the financial year 2019-20 to the Central Government. The recommendation of the Central Board of Trustees requires approval of the Government.

(d) & (e): The declaration of EPF Rate of Interest is a dynamic exercise depending upon the earnings of the particular year. There is no fixed/ standard rate of interest from which the declared EPF interest rate can be compared to arrive at gain/loss to employees.

- (a) & (b): Yes, Sir. Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) invest its corpus as per the Pattern of Investment notified by the Central Government and the internal guidelines of EPFO approved by the Central Board of Trustees, Employees' Provident Fund.
- (c) to (e): EPFO does not invest in any loss making private sector Company or infrastructure projects as per the internal guidelines of EPFO.
- (f): EPFO invests its corpus as per the Pattern of Investment notified by the Central Government.

- (e)whether the Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) has issued direction to the subordinate offices to implement the order of the High Court of Kerala in this regard and if so, the reasons therefor and if not, the reasons for non-implementation of the order of the High Court of Kerala; and
- (f)whether the EPFO is bound by the order of the Kerala High Court and if so, the reasons for delay in implementation and if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR GANGWAR)

(a): Special Leave Petition (SLP) (CIVIL) No. 16721-16722/2019 and Review Petition (CIVIL) No. 1430-1431/2019 have been submitted by Union of India and Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) respectively on the issue of admissibility of pension on full wages. Hon'ble Supreme Court through order dated 12.07.2019, has decided to list the stated SLP and Review Petition in open court.

Further, vide order dated 06.02.2020, in Writ Petition (C) No. 233/2018 (M. Chokalingam Vs. Union of India and others), the Hon'ble Supreme Court has directed the writ petitions from employees of exempted establishments to be listed together with aforesaid SLP and Review Petition.

(b) to (f): The matter is now sub-judice. As such, further steps in the matter hinges upon the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the aforesaid cases.
